Committeeman Schuler announced that the DPW Tom Sweeney will be working with the Boy Scouts to clean up Hicks Track.

- Morris County Soil Re-Forestation Agreement [Resolution 13-103]
 David Welsh of Morris County Soil Conservation answered questions from the Committee.
 Summary:
 - 1. The liability to the Township will not exceed \$4,000.00, (for up to 80 unsold trees)
 - 2. MCSC will make 400 Trees available to residents at an average of \$25.00
 - 3. Type of trees sold will be "bare root" Understory Hardwoods
 - Any one buying a tree will be required to attend a training class on tree care/planting at the Municipal Building. Date and time have not yet been established

• Wastewater Plant Upgrades

Committeeman Schuler and Mr. Henry reviewed with the Committee, the Design Memorandum from Tim Bradley [Omni International]. A discussion ensued. Mr. Henry will get clarification on the engineering fees and continue with the Grant Application. Final figures should be available for the March 27th Township Committee meeting.

- Ordinance 305-13 Millington Station Traffic Amendment Discussion Attorney Pidgeon explained the reason for the Ordinance
- Long Hill Emergency Communication System- Committeeman Roshto explained the Everbridge Citizens Alert System, offered by the County free of charge, will replace the Global Connect system that the Township is using and paying for currently. Residents will be able to sign up on the Long Hill Township website immediately. The Township will have complete control over the information that is sent to the residents. Committeeman Roshto will be overseeing a PR campaign to make the residents aware of the new system.

RESOLUTION 13-103

APPROVING SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH MORRIS COUNTY SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT FOR RE-FORESTATION PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Morris County Soil Conservation District ("MCSCD" or the "District") has offered to provide the necessary services to draft, review, inspect, advise and purchase trees for reforestation of areas of the Township after Hurricane Sandy and to train the residents of the Township of Long Hill on the handling and care of these trees; and

WHEREAS, the Township is agreeing to purchase, for an amount not exceeding \$4,000.00, those trees purchased by the District pursuant to this program that are not sold to residents of the Township by a specified date. The District has agreed, however, to pot, plant and care for those trees for the Township for a period of two years; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Township and its residents to participate in this program; and

WHEREAS, the MCSCD and the Township have the legal authority to enter into this agreement pursuant to the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq.;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Long Hill, in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- The Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Inter-local Services Agreement, a copy of which is attached hereto and which is incorporated herein by reference.

RESOLUTION 13- 108 CONCERNING COMPENSATORY TIME FOR EXEMPT EMPLOYEES AND AMENDING THE TOWNSHIP'S PERSONNEL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES MANUAL

WHEREAS, the Fair Labor Standards Act ("FLSA") provides that "any employee employed in a bona fide executive, administrative, or professional capacity" (as those terms are defined in 29 CFR §541.100 and §541.200) shall be exempt from the overtime and compensable time requirements of the Act (29 USC 213 (a)(1)); and

WHEREAS, the Township's personnel, policies and procedures were amended in 2011 to provide that:

"In accordance with the Fair Labor Standards Act . . ., the Township . . . has a policy of granting exempt (or administrative) employees compensatory time off in lieu of monetary compensation for hours worked in excess of 40 hours per week"; and

WHEREAS, the Fair Labor Standards Act does not require the payment of either overtime or compensatory time to "exempt" employees as defined in the Act and United States Department of Regulations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Long Hill in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey that:

- 1. The overtime compensation policy (revised April 20, 2011) in Section 4of the Township of Long Hill Personnel, Policies and Procedures manual is hereby repealed in its entirety and is replaced by the following language which was in the Personnel Policies and Procedures manual prior to April 20, 2011:

 Under the Federal Fair Labor Standards Act, certain employees in managerial, supervisory, administrative, computer or professional positions are exempt from the provisions of the Act. There are also employees who may be exempt because their compensation exceeds \$100,000 per year depending upon their job duties. The Administrative Assistant to the Township Administrator shall notify all Exempt employees of their status under the Act. Exempt employees are not eligible to receive overtime compensation or accumulate compensatory time and are required to work the normal workweek and any additional hours needed to fulfill their responsibilities. Time off consideration for large amounts of additional hours may be provided with the Township Administrator's prior approval and at the sole discretion of the Township Administrator.
- 2. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
