PROCLAMATION:

Chief Naga explained what the PAARI Initiative is and Mayor Dorsi presented Chief Naga with the Long Hill Township PAARI Initiative.

Mayor Dorsi read proclamations for Eagle Scout Matthew Meringolo, Eagle Scout Patrick Dempsey, Eagle Scout Michael Minogue, Eagle Scout James Lavender and Eagle Scout Michael Emanuel Sullivan.

Mayor Dorsi announced Kathryn DaSilva was unable to attend the meeting and will be presented with her Gold Award Proclamation at a later date.

LIAISON REPORTS:

- **Committeeman Rae** asked for a moment of silence for the all officers killed in the line of duty this past week and Detective Joseph Seals from Jersey City. Committeeman Rae also shared the Police Department statistics noting a major incident which occurred on Saturday, November 23rd. The Police Department with the help of two residents, who are also township employees, Colette Armenti and Patty Falzarano were able to provide information which helped the Police Department capture the suspect. He also shared that the Police Department in partnership with AAA has acquired 200 flashing safety lights which will be given out to at risk pedestrians and cyclists in town. Lastly, he requested residents remember to lock your vehicles and if you are traveling out of town for the holidays to utilize the Police Departments vacant house program.
- **Deputy Mayor Piserchia** followed up about a resident inquiring about the recent OPRA/OPMA S106 and S107 bills.
- **Mayor Dorsi** thanked the residents for their extreme generosity to the Fire Departments during their coin toss events. Mayor Dorsi congratulated Al Gallo for passing his test to become a certified DPW Director. Also reported that DPW has been doing road work and tree cleaning and urged residents to report any potholes they come across. Mayor Dorsi praised DPW for their hard work in cleanup of the most recent snow storm. Also reported DPW started putting up holiday decorations around town. Mayor Dorsi reminded residents to recycle and reminded residents about the cooking oil recycling program.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

- Long Hill received a grant from NJDOT in the amount of \$236,336.00 for Main Ave improvements. Planning stages will begin in 2020, work will not start until 2021.
- There were two bids that came in on December 10th for operation of the wastewater system from January 1st 2020 to the closing date with New Jersey American Water. Natural System Utilities came in at \$50,150 per month and Veolia was at \$54,267 per month. Attorney Pidegon is reviewing the submissions.
- There is a resolution entering into an agreement Hawkins Delafield who has been the attorney for the sewer sale. The agreement will be not to exceed \$30,000 and will get us through closing of the sewer sale. There will be \$66,000 coming back to the town to put towards closing cost.
- There was a Cross Hill Road Meeting with the residents December 10th. The Township Engineer will come to the January 22, 2019 meeting to present to the Township Committee plans for the project
- Stirling Train Station parking lot will be closed Friday, December 13th.

WHEREAS, the Township is seeking bids for the operation of its Wastewater Treatment System during that interim period;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Long Hill in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey, as follows:

WHEREAS, Sections 22-3.1 and 22-3.3 of the Township Code require a connection fee of \$10,120; and

WHEREAS, it appears that Jonathan and Kimberley DeCristofaro c/o 76 Overlook Road, block 102501 lot 1 was built in 1948; the property was subdivided March 5, 2019 creating block 12502 lot 1.02; and
