- Administrator Malool spoke about receiving a DOT grant 147,379 for resurfacing and curbing on Poplar Drive and gave update on Cross Hill Road . Administrator Malool also spoke about the recommendation from Township Engineer on holding off on phase 2 of Cross Hill Road to see how Phase 1 is working. Also received notification that our tax maps have been certified and the HD channel is now fully working.

ORDINANCE 486-22

AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF PROPERTY KNOWN AS BLOCK 10801, LOT 6.01 ON THE

TOWNSHIP TAX MAPS USING OPEN SPACE TRUST FUND AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND MONEY

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: *to authorize the purchase of the Eberle property located at 491 Valley Road, Gillette, and known as block 10801, lot 6.01 on the Township tax maps using Township open space trust funds and capital improvement funds.*

WHEREAS, the Township Committee wishes to purchase property known as Block 10801, Lot 6.01 on the Township Tax Maps using a portion of the property for open space and the remaining portion for other public purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Township has a duly adopted "Municipal Open Space, Recreation and Farmland and Historic Trust Fund" which can be used for that portion of the property that will be used for Open Space purposes; and

WHEREAS, the owners of that property and the Township have agreed to a purchase price of \$890,000; and

WHEREAS, there will be additional soft costs including engineering, legal and closing costs

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Long Hill in the County of Morris, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The purchase of the property described in the preamble is hereby authorized.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated \$915,000 (which also covers costs of acquisition and other soft costs), of which \$457,500 will be taken from the Township Open Space Trust Fund and \$457,500 from the Capital Improvement Fund for purchasing said property.

Section 3. The Mayor and Township Clerk are hereby authorized to execute a purchase contract in form acceptable to the Township Attorney and the Township Administrator.

Section 4. The Township Attorney is authorized to order title insurance, a survey and anything else required by law or necessary to close on the property and to protect the Township's interests.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

WHEREAS, in addition to the Special Event Permit, Home for Good Dog Rescue has submitted an Alcoholic Beverage Control Application to the State of New Jersey for the "Taste of Italy" event to be held on March 26, 2022 at the Long Hill Community Center; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has reviewed the application and has no objection to the granting of a special permit to be issued to the applicant to sell alcoholic beverages at the affair to be held on the date and premises noted, subject to, however, the following conditions:

1. The consumption of alcoholic beverages shall be restricted to the area as outlined in the site plan supplied with the application. No alcoholic beverages shall be possessed or consumed in any area not designated on this site plan.
2. No person under the age of 21 shall be served alcoholic beverages. Home for Good Dog Rescue staff and volunteer retired police officers shall be responsible for verifying the ages of those patrons who wish to consume alcoholic beverages, check identification to verify age, issue wristbands, and monitor the area to prevent "hand off's."
3. No person assumed to be under the influence of alcohol shall be served, permitted to walk, or allowed to drive from the Long Hill Community Center or the designated area.
4. Alcoholic beverages shall only be served and/or consumed between the hours of 6:00pm and 11:00pm on March 26, 2022

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Long Hill, in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey as follows:

1. The Township Committee, the licensing authority of the municipality, has no objection to the granting of a special permit and consents thereto with the special conditions as outlined by the Chief of Police.
